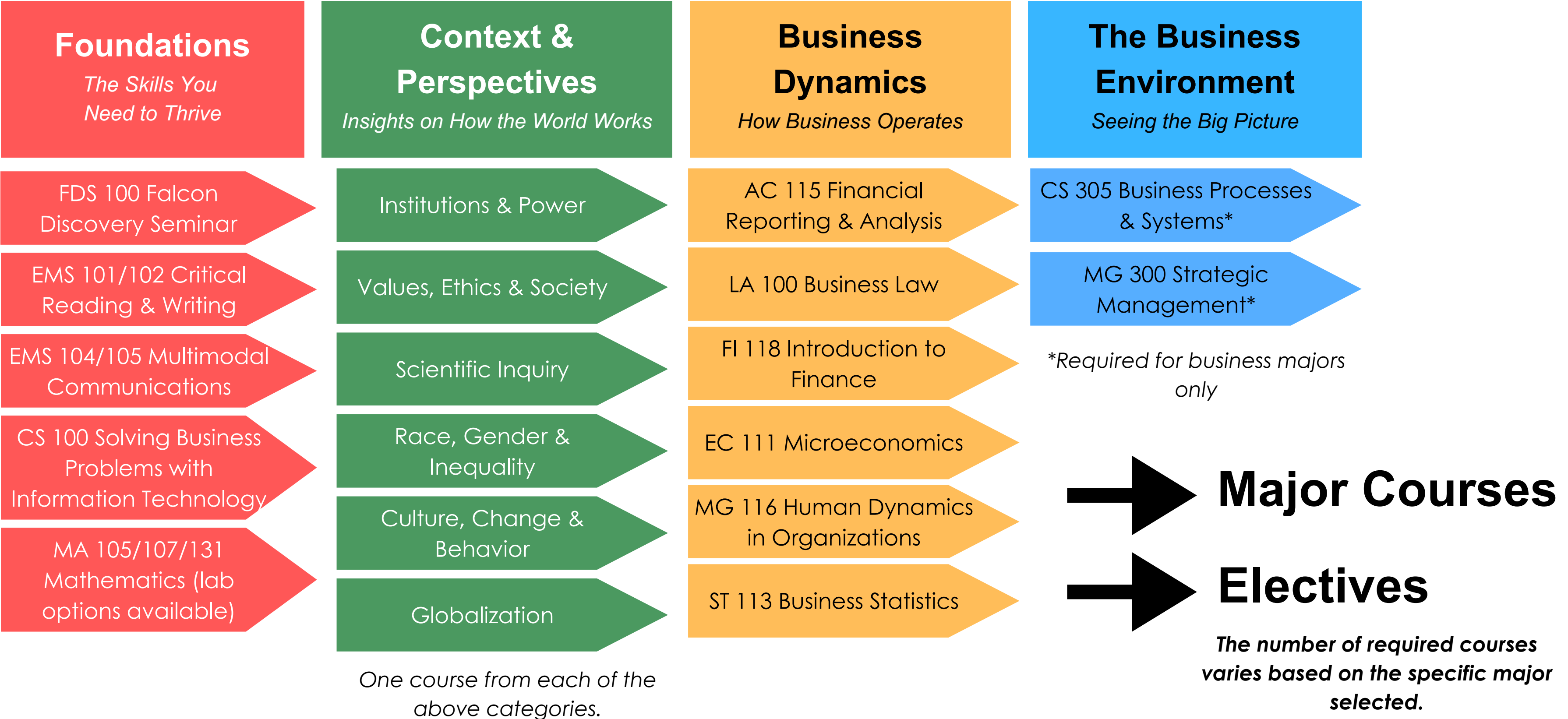


Bentley's Core Degree Requirements

120 credits, meeting specific requirements, are needed to earn a bachelor's degree at Bentley. This equates to forty 3-credit courses, typically completed as five courses each fall semester and five courses each spring semester for four years. The following course categories are applicable to most majors. *Please see the DegreeWorks Audit video for a more complete overview of degree requirements.*
