



# Choosing Your Courses Worksheet

## COURSE 1: CS 100 OR MATH

**In your first semester, you will take CS 100 or Math.**

- ☐ For your first semester, you can choose to take either CS 100 or your Math course. Your math course options will be based on your math placement and declared major. You can view this course in your Workday account or through the Schedule Planner.

- ☐ If you already have credit for MA 105, MA 107, or MA 131, you do not need to take a math course—unless you are planning to major in a math-department major (Actuarial Science, Data Analytics, Quantitative Economics, or Mathematical Sciences)

## COURSE 2: FDS 100

**FDS 100 is required in your first semester.**

There are several topic options to choose from, and we recommend reviewing them to find those that interests you.

## COURSE 3: EMS 101/101L/102/102L

**EMS 101/101L or EMS 102/102L is required in your first semester.**

Your EMS course is based on your placement results.

- ☐ Your assigned EMS placement will appear in your Schedule Planner. To select a section, make sure it is checked in your course list. You can also use the gear icon in Schedule Planner to filter and view all EMS section options.
- ☐ If you have prior credit for EMS 101, you should register for EMS 104 instead.

## COURSE 4: BUSINESS DYNAMICS

**In your first two years at Bentley, you will take six Business Dynamics courses.** For your first semester, you can choose between the following: **LA 100 Business Law**, **MG 116 Human Dynamics in Organizations**, or **EC 111 Microeconomics**.

- ☐ You need to add one of these courses to your Schedule Planner list.
- ☐ Business Dynamics classes can be taken in any order.
- ☐ If your intended major is listed in the table below, consider prioritizing the courses that are prerequisites for that major.
- ☐ **If you have been awarded 12 credits or more**, you are eligible to choose from FI 118 Introduction to Finance or AC 115 Financial Reporting and Analysis
- ☐ If you have prior credit for any Business Dynamics, choose a different one.

## COURSE 5: CONTEXT & PERSPECTIVES

**You'll take six Context and Perspectives courses during your time at Bentley, one from each theme. Students are expected to take one in the first semester. Students are able to take Context and Perspectives from 100-400 course level.**
