Advanced Standing Credit

If you have credentials to be considered for potential Advanced Standing Credit (AP result, IB results, A Levels, etc.), please be sure to submit your official documentation to the Office of Undergraduate Admission as soon as it is available. The final deadline for submitting this documentation is October 15, 2021, but as this potential credit could impact your fall schedule, it is *most helpful to submit the credentials now*. If you are eligible for advanced standing credit for a particular course, please be sure you are not registered for the same course at Bentley.

Attention Honors Program Students

If you are a member of the Honors Program, your fall 2021 schedule must include the following Honors courses:

- EXP 101H Expository Writing I

The First Year @ Bentley

Individual schedules may vary, but most incoming first-year students' courses will look something like this:

Course 1	Intro. to Finance & Accounting I (GB 112)	Intro. to Finance & Accounting II (GB 212)
Course 2	Calculus or Applied Calculus I (MA 123/123L or MA 131)	Calculus or Applied Calculus II (MA 126/126L or MA 139)
Course 3	Expository Writing I (EXP 101L/102/102L) OR (EXP 101/1 st Year Course)	Expository Writing II (EXP 201L/202/202L) OR (EXP 101/1 st Year Course)
Course 4	1 st Year Course (IT 101, GB 110, PH 101)	1 st Year Course (IT 101, GB 110, PH 101)
Course 5	Student Choice (GLS, HI, SO/PS, ML, IT 101, GB 110, PH 101)	Student Choice (GLS, HI, SO/PS, ML, IT 101, GB 110, PH 101)
Course 6	FS 111 - First Year Seminar (1-Credit Course)	CDI 101 - Career Development (Non-Credit Course – Spring term)

Important Scheduling Reminders

- FS 111 and GB 112 are fall must-takes for all first-year students.
- If your EXP placement is 101L, 102, or 102L, that course is also a must-take for your fall schedule.
- Include at least one of the following courses: GB 110, IT 101, PH 101, and EXP 101 (if applicable).
- Make sure you plan for breaks, meals, etc.
- Don't schedule more than three academic classes in one day.*
- Don't schedule more than two academic classes in a row.*
- Don't schedule more than one evening class.
- Take into account any academic accommodations you may receive.

*Academic courses are 3 or 4 credits each
