

Expository Writing Placement

The Expository Writing sequence is a Bentley requirement and must be fulfilled in your first few semesters at Bentley if it is not already satisfied by your prior credit.

Students are placed based on the placement essays completed prior to registration.

The courses numbered 102 and 102L are reserved for students whose native language is not English.

EXP101L, EXP201L, EXP102L and EXP202L are lab courses. The lab courses provide additional time each week to work on lessons and engage in writing workshops.

A detailed list of all prior credit you earned (TC, IB, AP) prior to coming to Bentley for first year students.

PRE-REGISTRATION

- Pre-Registration (now through January 5, 2021)
- New Students should
 - Be sure all official transcripts/test scores are sent to Undergraduate Admission for evaluation. Pay attention to subsequent email communications from them and Bentley Connect asking you for more information.
 - Fill out the <u>New Student Registration Information Survey</u> that was included in the email from our office. This information is important for us to have!
 - Make an advising appointment NOW for the beginning of January. An email was sent to your Bentley email account from kovalles@navigate.bentley.edu with a link to make an appointment.
 - Advisors will
 - Assess all relevant prior credit, relevant placements from faculty, and survey results. On January 5, 2021, advisors will pre-register all new students for their MOST IMPORTANT spring courses.


ACADEMIC ADVISING

 - Making a list of any questions or concerns related to spring registration they would like to discuss with an academic advisor during their appointment. Please note the purpose of this appointment is to discuss spring registration. Students will have subsequent appointments over the spring term with their academic advisor to discuss additional topics.
- Advisors will:
 - Answer all spring registration questions
 - Walk students through important pieces of Workday and DegreeWorks
 - Send students any additional resources to support them through registration

COMPLETE REGISTRATION


- Complete Registration (Beginning at 10:00 AM ET on January 12, 2021)
- New Students should:
 - Prepare to complete their registration on January 12, 2021 by choosing courses in advance according to the guidance received during their academic advising appointment.
 - Mark their calendars now! Add/Swap will open for ALL new students at 10:00 AM ET on January 12, 2021. This is the first opportunity to make changes to your spring schedule.
- Advisors will:
 - Be available via Zoom Drop-Ins to assist from 10:00 AM 3:00 PM ET. You will receive an email with the link a few days in advance.



COURSE MODALITIES

Hybrid Classroom (HB)

Faculty member is in the classroom and some students attend class live in person while others attend live online, keeping classroom density at safe levels to allow for physical distancing.

Synchronous Online Learning (SN)

Faculty member and students are remote but interact in real time.

Asynchronous Online Learning (AL)

Faculty and students are completely online with no specific class time assigned for the course. Students can access class lessons at a time of their choosing. Online instructional materials can include recorded video lectures, interactive simulations, and discussion boards where classmates can share their views or ask questions.

*Course modality is subject to change

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

If you are a new student entering the U.S. for the first time in F-1 status, you must be registered in at least **one** hybrid (HB) course and attend that course in-person at least 50% of the time.

- Academic Services will pre-register you for one hybrid course. Be sure you do not remove it on January 12.

- Please note: Students who are SEVIS transfers (i.e. studied in Fall 2020 in the U.S. in F-1 status at another school) do not need one Hybrid (HB) course.
