Undergraduate Academic Advising Model

All students are assigned a professional academic advisor just prior to their Bentley enrollment. The student's academic advisor is a designated resource for questions about course planning, major selection, academic challenges, etc. This is a partnership in which both the student and the advisor work together to meet the student's objectives.

- with assigned academic advisor or another professional advisor
- best for: more complex discussions, longrange academic planning




Academic Support

If a student is finding a particular class to be difficult, they are encouraged to:


- First, talk with their professor via office hours or email.
