Bentley Climate Survey 2024

The Bentley University Sexual Assault Survey was hosted by The Office of Equal Opportunity and Institutional Equity. The survey was anonymous, confidential, and built around a model developed by the Massachusetts Department of Higher Education. Email invitations and four reminders were sent to all students who were actively enrolled in Spring 2024.

The survey was open for 30 days, from April 1 through April 30, 2024

Total students who participated: **383** (out of approximately 5100 students enrolled Spring 2024)

The student response rate (**7.5%**), "too low to be confident that the results significantly scale to the entire student population. An ideal response rate for a census survey would be 75-80%."1

The following analysis presents findings from completed surveys only; data from partially completed surveys are not included.

"Hello Bentley Students,

April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month, when we acknowledge the impact of sexual and gender-based violence on individuals and communities. This year's theme for Sexual Assault Awareness Month is: "Building Connected Communities." As part of our work to ensure a campus community that is welcoming and safe for all students, the Office of Equal Opportunity and Institutional Equity is pleased to announce Bentley's 2024 Sexual Misconduct Climate Survey. This survey will go live on April 1st and will be active until April 30, 2024, coinciding with Sexual Assault Awareness Month. Students, your voices have power – and you can help us to build a safe and respectful environment at Bentley. Engaging with this survey will allow us to better understand the lived experience of our students, and how we can best protect and respond to these concerns. Your response will impact our prevention education and training strategies, student conduct, Title IX processes, and rights and resources for involved students. "

Confidentiality

"The survey will be administered via Qualtrics using an anonymous link – no personal information, including Bentley ID, name, Bentley Email Address, etc. will be gathered via embedded data. Additionally, when survey respondents complete the survey, they will be automatically redirected to a separate Qualtrics survey to gather contact information should they opt-in to the incentive lottery. At no point will the respondents' answers from the survey relate to the contact information provided in the second survey.

Survey responses will be gathered via Qualtrics, and the survey data will be stored on Bentley's servers. Any data reporting will be done in the aggregate. Only members of the Office of Business Intelligence and the Office of Equal Opportunity and institutional Equity will have access to the of the individual responses".

Thank you for participating in Bentley University's Campus Sexual Misconduct Survey. In 2021, the Massachusetts legislature enacted a special law known as the 2021 Campus Sexual Assault Law (CSAL), which requires that all private and public higher education institutions in Massachusetts conduct a campus sexual misconduct climate survey no less than every four years and post results on their website within 120 days of completion and analysis.

This survey will attempt to measure the prevalence of sexual assault on campus, assess students' attitudes and awareness about sexual misconduct and how to report it on campus, and help schools identify ways to address the problem.

Please note that this survey is confidential, anonymous, and completely voluntary.

If you would like to opt in to a random drawing for a chance to win a prize, you will have the option to do so at the end of the survey. Your name will not be associated with your answers to the survey, which will be collected separately.



Your participation in the survey is completely voluntary. You may skip any question you are not comfortable answering and may exit the survey at any time. 








Since you have been a student at Bentley University, has someone had contact with you involving penetration or oral sex without your active, ongoing voluntary agreement? Examples include someone:




Since you have been a student at Bentley University, has someone kissed or sexually touched you without your active, ongoing voluntary agreement? Examples include someone:




These incidents were with more than one person. (# of people) 7 2





All of the incidents were with the same person.




How would you describe the gender of the person(s) who engaged in the conduct towards you?







What was your relationship to the other person or persons?




Was the person (or persons) a student(s) at Bentley University?






Had you been using alcohol or drugs just prior to the incident?





During the incident to what extent did you feel:






Do you believe that any aspect of your identity played a role in any of the incidents of sexual violence you have identified above?




Do you believe that any aspect of your identity played a role in any of the incidents of dating violence you have identified above? If YES, please select all that apply:








Do you believe that any aspect of your identity played a role in any of the incidents of sexual harassment you have identified above?










Do you believe that any aspect of your identity played a role in any of the incidents of sexual harassment you have identified above?

The following statements describe how Bentley University might handle it if a student reported an incident of sexual misconduct.








Before coming to Bentley University, had you received any information or education (that did not come from Bentley University) about sexual misconduct?

Since you came to Bentley, which of the following have you done?




Since coming to Bentley University, have you received written (e.g., brochures, emails) or verbal information (e.g., presentations, training) from anyone at Bentley University about the following?






