Our first-year fellows took learning beyond the classroom during a Falcon Discovery Seminar (FDS) field trip to explore fast fashion firsthand. Students visited fast fashion retailers to research the “Wicked Problem” of sustainability and examine how marketing influences consumer behavior and industry practices. Working in groups, they created short videos connecting what they observed in stores to key concepts from class. We wrapped up the afternoon at Shake Shack, where students reflected on their findings, shared laughs, and continued the conversation in a relaxed setting. The experience was not only academically engaging but also a great bonding moment for the class, and for some students, it was even their first subway ride into Boston.


Notes from the Field
