

Leon Goldman, MD retired as the Chief Compliance and Privacy Officer for the Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center(BIDMC), Boston, MA, a Harvard Medical School affiliate in 2011. He then took on the role of Privacy Officer and Associate Medical Director for Kyruus, Inc. in Boston. As Chief Compliance and Privacy Officer at the Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, he built their compliance program from the ground up into a comprehensive program covering corporate compliance, research compliance, privacy, and conflicts of interest. He worked closely with the Faculty Practice Plan to help develop their program and worked closely with them to coordinate the two compliance programs.

Prior to becoming the Chief Compliance and Privacy Officer, he was a practicing general surgeon and a member of the Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center's Department of Surgery as well as on the faculty at Harvard Medical School. From 1994-1995 he served as the Interim Chair of the Department of Surgery for the Beth Israel Hospital. When the Executive Fellows were transitioned to the Advisory Board of the Hoffman Center for Business Ethics, he became a member of the Board. While an active compliance officer he was a member of the Compliance Officer Forum of the Association of American Medical Colleges and was elected to the Compliance Officer Roundtable of the American Hospital Association. In 2007, he received the Investing in Information Award from the Massachusetts Health Data Consortium for commitment and actions to improve the state's health information infrastructure.
