WELCOME TO BENTLEY UNIVERSITY!

It's move-in day and we're excited to have you on campus this fall. To make this process as easy as possible, here's a map and step by step directions for students and families to follow as you arrive, check in, get tested and move in.

1. Welcome

Make sure you are arriving on campus at your preassigned move-in date and time. This year's arrival is specifically scheduled and carefully staggered to ensure safety and proper physical distancing for all students and families.

Remember!

- Find and confirm your move-in time and testing time in the Housing Portal at bentley.edu/housingportal.
- One car per family at your residence hall additional cars will be directed to a separate parking lot on upper campus. *Indicated on map* △
- Two people can join a student on campus, but only one person can accompany a student inside the residence hall at a time.
- Face coverings are mandatory on campus at all times!
- Please keep your moving pass visible on the dashboard at all times—you will receive this pass as you arrive on campus.

2. Now that you're on campus, our team is here to help

- Your first stop is the upper level of the Miller Parking Garage, indicated in red on the map. Drive there first and park. All non-students must remain in the car at this time. *Indicated on map* ③
- Students will be greeted and directed to go downstairs to the lower level where they will take their first screening test for COVID-19.

Remember: all students must bring a photo ID to their screening test.

3. Arriving to Bentley from out of state?

Massachusetts has a strict policy for all travelers from countries or states other than Connecticut, Maine, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York and Vermont. If you're from one of these states, or Massachusetts, you can move in today without any additional steps.

■ If you are from different state or country, you are required to have a negative result from a PCR COVID-19 test taken 72 hours prior to your arrival or you must quarantine for 14 days. Please bring your negative test results or documentation of your quarantine with you to the lower level of the Miller Parking Garage for verification.

- If you are arriving from out of state and cannot provide a negative test result or details of your quarantine, you will need leave campus and quarantine until you have received a negative test result from your Bentley University screening.
- A list of discounted local hotels is available at bentley.edu/hotels.

4. Your screening test should take no more than 15 minutes.

Upon exiting the testing area, all students will be provided a wrist band to identify that they have been screened for COVID-19 by Bentley University. Students with wrist bands will be permitted to return to their car and continue on to their residence hall for move-in. Bentley staff and the campus map on the back of this sheet will help you find the way.

5. When arriving at your residence hall, students should check in with the ResidentialCenter staff member on site to verify information.

New students will receive their Bentley University Student IDs at this time along with specific moving instructions. You will have 30 minutes to unload items from the vehicle. Remember, no more than one student and one helper should be inside the residence hall at a time.

6. Once you have unloaded your items or reached your 30 minute time limit, please move your car to the upper lots indicated on the map, to make space for the next round of students moving in.

If students need a few extra minutes of help after the car is moved, that's okay, but non-tested accompanying individuals will be asked to leave campus as quickly as possible so that the residence halls remain safe, clean and physically distanced for the next group of students arriving on campus.

7. Thank you for your cooperation on this busy day.
