VISIT DIFFERENT COLLEGE ENVIRONMENTS. Narrow down your choices to where you feel most comfortable (big versus small, urban versus suburban, for example).

SPEAK OUT. Don't be shy about asking questions of the admissions staff and tour guides.

MEET YOUR TEACHERS. Explore academic departments and if possible, try to make an appointment to speak with a professor.

GRAB SOME GRUB. Have lunch in the dining hall.

SEE THE NEIGHBORHOOD. Take a walk off campus to learn more about the surrounding area.

TAKE NOTES. Take lots of notes and photos, and keep a record of each visit so you can review later.

FOLLOW UP. Demonstrate your interest by following up with people you met.
