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An Overview of the Residential Center

Our Office: The Bentley Residential Center staff are energetic, dynamic, and engaging professionals who are student-centered and passionate about their work. As a member of our department, you would be working with a team comprised of 98 Resident Assistants, 7 Residence Directors, 4 Assistant Directors, one Associate Director, a Housing Operations Specialist, and the Associate Dean of Student Affairs. Together, this team, works to build a strong and vibrant campus community and culture.

Our Mission: The Residential Center is dedicated to creating a safe, civil, and inclusive residential community. Our staff strives to develop a comfortable living environment where the personal and intellectual growth of all residential students is fostered.

Our Educational Priority: Students at Bentley will become active organizational leaders engaged in their residential community.

About the RA Role

Overview of RA Duties

Resident Assistants (RAs) are student staff members living in the residence halls who facilitate opportunities that have a positive impact on students living in the halls. RAs build connections with and amongst individuals living in their communities, through one-on-one interactions and community programming and meetings. RAs foster inclusive communities and assist in maintaining a safe and positive environment for all students living within the residence halls. RAs are held to a high standard of accountability and personal conduct due to the unique role-modeling needed in this position. As such, RAs are an extension of the Residential Center and act as staff members in the office. RAs should conduct themselves in a manner that is consistent with the mission of the Residential Center and Bentley University.

Academic Year Time Commitment

The RA position is a full academic year (consecutive Fall and Spring semesters) commitment. The contract period includes all mandatory trainings prior to the start of each semester and closing responsibilities at the end of each semester (the day after closing). The contract period also requires RAs to fulfill duty responsibilities during scheduled breaks and holidays observed by the University; these breaks can include Fall Break, Thanksgiving Break, and Spring Break. When the University is closed (winter break/summer break), RAs are not required to stay on campus. RAs can have the option to remain on campus during Winter/Summer breaks, in the RA role, if the department considers necessary.

RA Position Compensation

Resident Assistants within the First Year and Suites Areas are compensated with their room and the value 12 meal plan (RAs can switch from the value 12 to the value 15 and pay the difference).

RAs assigned to the Apartments Area are compensated with their room. Apartments include full kitchens, but staff members can purchase a meal plan if they would like.

This compensation will be credited towards the staff member's Bentley account at the beginning of each semester. A candidate is responsible for determining the impact on their financial aid package, if any. The Residential Center covers the full cost of an RAs housing assignment on campus.

Take note: If an RA is assigned to a traditional hall or suite, room and board is covered. RAs in the Apartments Area will only have their room covered. Some assignments may provide an RA with the opportunity to live with a roommate(s). In that circumstance, RAs will have the chance to select their roommates. If roommates are not selected, the Residential Center will place students in RA rooms through the housing selection process. If an RA is released from the RA position, or chooses to resign, the roommates that that RA chose will be asked to move out of that housing assignment.

Position Requirements

- RAs must be undergraduate students enrolled in a degree granting program. Current RAs can petition to return to the position during their graduate year. More information can be obtained about this opportunity through their Residence Director.
- RAs must be a full-time student and eligible for housing by maintaining at least 12 credits (unless approved by the department) throughout their term of employment.
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 is required at time of hire and two weeks prior to the commencement of duties in August. RAs must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 throughout each semester to remain in the position. Each semester, the Residential Center will review all RA cumulative GPAs. If any RA's GPA does not meet these requirements, the RA no longer meets job requirements, and their contract will be reevaluated.
- RAs must be free of any Title IX allegations and have resolved any pending charges/investigations two weeks prior to the commencement of RA duties in August or one week prior to the commencement of duties when starting the position at any other time during the year. RAs must be in good conduct standing with the university. Each semester, the Residential Center will conduct a review of all RA conduct histories.
- ✓ If a staff member is found responsible for a violation of University Policy/Title IX after the time of hire, employment will be reevaluated with the result ranging from a verbal warning to termination.
- ✓ RAs must not owe any outstanding debt to the university.
- RAs extracurricular activities and other jobs are limited to 20 hours a week. Exceeding the 20 hour a week limit would require permission from your supervisor.
- ✓ RAs should not take courses or hold jobs that interfere with the requirements of this position.
- RAs must conduct themselves in a professional manner that meets the expectations outlined in the position description and manual.

Bentley's Defined Communities

As a Resident Assistant you will have the opportunity to serve within one of Bentley's Defined Communities. The Defined Communities at Bentley provide an enhanced environment of learning with the residence halls. Each community provides dedicated spaces for students with similar interests and passions to live and learn around a central theme or academic focus.

Interviewing Tips

- Consider using career development resources from <u>https://www.bentley.edu/university-life/pulsifer-career-development</u>
- Show up on time for all scheduled interviews or follow-up requests.
- Prepare for your interview. Be familiar with the role and its time requirements.
- Plan to provide detailed, but concise with interview questions. Interviews have a set time limit, and you want to be sure that the interviewer can effectively review your full and intended answer by the end of it.
